

How to Organize a United Nations Trivia Night

Besides be a fun and easy activity to organize, a trivia night is a great way to involve people who might be less likely to attend a formal lecture. It's a great interactive event and people end up learning more about the UN and its history.

You can also use a trivia night as a way to raise money for charitable causes. Traditionally, trivia nights are held in pubs with people paying a small fee (maybe \$10) to participate. The money can be donated to a cause or split, with half going to the designated cause and half to the winning team. But, if you are using this as a fundraiser, you can always ask businesses to donate prizes. They don't need to be elaborate, but gift certificates, free food, etc. makes nice prizes.

Basic Format: All of the players form teams and compete against each in other in several rounds of questions. Points are awarded for correct answers. The team that gets the most points wins the main prize. Consolation prizes or smaller prizes can also be awarded throughout the night. For example, smaller prizes could be awarded to the team with the fewest points, the one that demonstrated the most spirit or gave the funniest answers. Feel free to make up your own categories.

Scoring: There are a couple of ways to handle scoring. One is to allot each question the same value and simply track each correct answer with the most points winning. Another option is to allow teams to weight their answers differently by allowing contestants to either choose a value of 1, 3, 5 or 7 points. With each question coming from a different category, teams can weight their answers to maximize their points according to their strengths. Decide which method you prefer. The advantage of the straightforward scoring is that it's easy to keep score. The weighted system creates more interaction and strategizing within the team.

Timing: You should plan for the quiz night to last about two hours. It's meant to be a fun time and you want people to enjoy themselves, so keep that in mind when scheduling the event. Keep it social, provide food and drinks. Never underestimate the marketing power of free food!

Making the UN Connection: the UN-related trivia questions we've provide gives everyone the opportunity to learn more about the history of the UN and how different UN agencies work. Don't worry, there are plenty of popular culture questions to keep this event from sounding too much like a history lecture!

Another idea is to ask people to form teams named after countries. They can even dress in costumes related to their country. Award prizes for best costumes.

How the night will go: A good trivia night will have 6-8 rounds of questions with anywhere from 5 to 8 questions per round. Teams should not be larger than 10 people. An ideal mix is about 5-10 people. How teams divide will depend on your total attendance.

One person needs to be the MC or Quizmaster. For this role, you definitely want someone who is energetic and funny. The quizmaster will be responsible for not only reading the questions, but making sure that the teams are following the rules *and* having fun.

It's usually a good idea to have someone else do the scoring. This person checks the answers, keeps scores, and can help with entertaining the participants.

While the goal of this event is to educate people about global issues, you still want to entertain and engage people, so many of the questions we've provided are informal, funny, or drawn from popular culture. Feel free to mix up your presentation based on what you think will entertain people the most.

The room should be set up with enough space for the teams to sit in groups near each other, but not so close that the teams can't talk and strategize among themselves. Ideally there are separate tables for each team. Consider using a microphone if the room is really large, so that everyone can hear the questions. If that isn't possible, you could either have the questions written down on slips of paper for the teams, or just walk throughout the area repeating the question a few times.

Each team should be provided with pens and paper to write their question. It's useful to have papers preprinted with the space for the answer. This makes scoring easier. We've provided an answer sheet that you can print out and use.

UNICEF	United Nations Children's Fund	After World War II, European children faced famine and disease. UNICEF was created in December 1946 to provide food, clothing and health care to them. Today, UNICEF works in 191 countries.
UNITAR	UN Institute for Training and Research	UNITAR was established in 1965 as an autonomous body within the United Nations with the purpose of enhancing the effectiveness of the Organization through appropriate training and research.
UNSIC	UN System Influenza Coordination	UNSIC is responsible for cooperation and coordination within the UN system in support of different initiatives underway to address the avian flu epidemic and the threat of a human pandemic.
UNIFEM	United Nations Development Fund for Women	UNIFEM is the women's fund at the United Nations. It provides financial and technical assistance to innovative programs and strategies to foster women's empowerment and gender equality. Placing the advancement of women's human rights at the centre of all of its efforts, UNIFEM focuses its activities on four strategic areas: (1) reducing feminized poverty, (2) ending violence against women, (3) reversing the spread of HIV/AIDS among women and girls, and (4) achieving gender equality in democratic governance in times of peace as well as war.
UNRWA	UN Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East	Following the 1948 Arab-Israeli conflict, UNRWA was established to carry out direct relief and works programs for Palestine refugees. UNRWA is unique in terms of its long-standing commitment to one group of refugees and its contributions to the welfare and human development of four generations of Palestine refugees. Originally envisaged as a temporary organization, the Agency has gradually adjusted its programs to meet the changing needs of the refugees. Today, UNRWA is the main provider of basic services - education, health, relief and social services - to over 4.3 million registered Palestine refugees in the Middle East.
UNOG	United Nations Office at Geneva	Housed at the Palais des Nations, the United Nations Office at Geneva serves as the representative office of the Secretary-General in Geneva. A focal point for multilateral diplomacy, UNOG services more than 8,000 meetings every year, making it one of the busiest conference centers in the world. With more than 1,600 staff, it is the biggest duty stations outside of United Nations headquarters in New York.

UNU	UN University	Established in 1969 and based in Tokyo, the mission of the UNU is to contribute, through research and capacity building, to efforts to resolve the pressing global problems that are the concern of the United Nations and its Member States. The UNU aims to fulfill its mission by performing four key roles that are based on the mandate given to the University by its Charter: to be an international community of scholars; to form a bridge between the United Nations and the international academic community; to serve as a think-tank for the United Nations system; and to contribute to capacity building, particularly in developing countries.
FAO	The Food and Agriculture Organization	FAO leads international efforts to defeat hunger. Serving both developed and developing countries, FAO acts as a neutral forum where all nations meet as equals to negotiate agreements and debate policy. FAO is also a source of knowledge and information. It helps developing countries and countries in transition modernize and improve agriculture, forestry and fisheries practices and ensure good nutrition for all. Since its founding in 1945, it has focused special attention on developing rural areas, home to 70 percent of the world's poor and hungry people.
UNV	UN Volunteers	The United Nations Volunteers program is the volunteer arm of the United Nations. It was created by the UN General Assembly in 1970 to serve as an operational partner in development cooperation at the request of UN member states. A public charity established to support the work of the UN	When Ted Turner decided he wanted to make (at the time) the world’s largest charitable donation, and give it to the UN, he was unable to because he was an individual, not a national government. So in 1998 he founded UNF, to develop public private partnerships, make grants, and engage in public outreach to support the UN.

Where can UN issued stamps be used?	Only when mailing from UN territory or offices.	The UN Postal Administration is the postal agency for the UN that issues postage stamps specifically to be used for mailing things from UN offices. The idea for the UN to issue their own stamps originated in 1947 with José Arce, the ambassador from Argentina and president of the United Nations General Assembly, who was himself a philatelist (stamp collector).
What is Cambodia's only World Heritage Site?	Angkor	Angkor is one of the most important archaeological sites in South-East Asia. Stretching over some 400 sq. km, including forested area, Angkor Archaeological Park contains the magnificent remains of the different capitals of the Khmer Empire, from the 9th to the 15th century. These include the famous Temple of Angkor Wat and, at Angkor Thom, the Bayon Temple with its countless sculptural decorations.

L'Oreal	The L'Oreal/UNESCO Awards for Women in Science aims to improve the position of women in science by annually recognizing outstanding women researchers who have contributed to scientific progress.
